

Tile Works Tablerunner

20" x 48"

Refer to page 52 in the Quiltmaker's 100 Block Volume II, block #162 for block instructions. Make 3 blocks to use in the tablerunner.

Supply List for sashing, border and binding:

3/4 yard cream for sashing and flying geese

1/3 yard red for flying geese

1/3 yard black for binding

1 3/4 yards backing

Cutting:

From cream fabric, cut:

Flying Geese:

Fit to be Geese Ruler Method: 2 – 5 1/2" strips into: 8 – 5 1/2" squares diagonally twice

Quiltmaker Magazine Method: 2 – 5 1/4" strips, into: 8 – 5 1/4" squares

AND: 5 – 2 1/2" strips, into: 4 – 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" pieces

2 – 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares

Piece to make: 2 – 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" pieces

From the red fabric, cut:

Flying Geese:

Fit to be Geese Ruler Method: 3 – 3 1/4" strips, into: 30 – 3 1/4" squares, cut diagonally once

Quiltmaker Magazine Method: 3 – 2 7/8" strips, into: 30 – 2 7/8" squares

From the black fabric, cut:

5 – 2 1/4" strips for binding

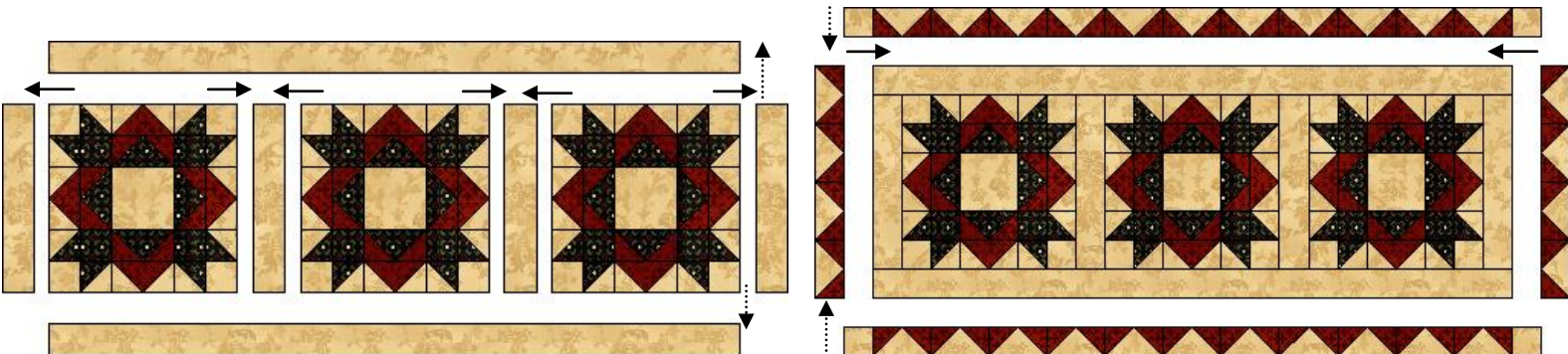
Piecing:

1. Sew the flying geese using the method that you choose. Refer to page 19 of the Quiltmaker 100 Blocks Volume II magazine for constructing flying geese and the Fit to be Geese instructions for the Fit to be Geese Method. Press in the direction of the arrows. Make 30.

2. Sew the flying geese border in rows of 11 for the top and bottom with the 2 1/2" squares on the ends and 5 flying geese for the sides. Press in the direction of the arrows.



3. Sew the tablerunner in rows using 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" pieces of cream between the blocks and the 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" pieces of cream on the top and bottom. Press towards the cream fabric. Sew on the flying geese border and press towards the cream pieces.



4. Quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
